



This year's athletic efforts may be divided into two sections corresponding to the two trimesters. In the first trimester a combination of hard luck and the scheduling of some of the house's weaker sports made for a comparatively poor showing by the purple and gold. The second trimester saw a reversal in the tides of fortune, however, as Pi Lam, led by her powerful bowling and basketball teams, stormed into the position of sixth place in the sixteen team Orange League as this issue went to press, and with some of her strongest sports yet to come.

The first sport of the year was water basketball. Pi Lam went down to a brave defeat at the hands of Delta Tau Delta, a strong five that eventually reached the semi-finals.

The next sport was football. The Pi Lam team, led by all-campus selections Rick Solloway and Leon Chira, defeated the ATO and SAE elevens by wide margins. The two narrow defeats suffered by the squad could easily be contributed to a controversial ruling that declared Brother Chira ineligible. It was a tough break for the purple and gold, whose squad intact had been called one of the best ever on campus.

Volleyball followed, and after an easy victory over the KA's, the Pi Lam team was defeated twice, by perennial powers Phi Delt and SAE.

In track the house again received a disappointment, as past champion and Brother Alan Hirsch was unable to compete in his specialty, the high jump. However, Brother Sandy Sadja brought much glory to the house as he copped a first place medal in the 220-yard dash.

The first sport of the second trimester was bowling. In a genuine surprise, the Pi Lam five, sparked by all-campus selections Mike Segal and Richard Sherman, rolled over such worthy opponents as Sigma Chi, ATO, and Theta Chi, and smashed their way into the finals before bowing to a fine Phi Tau squad. This outstanding showing by the bowling team was a great lift in the hopes for an outstanding finish in the Orange League.

The string of high-quality squads was continued into basketball season, as Pi Lam's outstanding cagers, led by brothers Alan Hirsch and George Bant, have, at the time of this writing, reached the semi-finals, having disposed of the Teps, Betas, and Delts. Pi Lam's well-polished squad has been the talk of the campus, and stands a good chance of copping the championship.

With such perennially strong sports as handball and softball yet to come, Pi Lam once again seems assured of a high in the Orange League. Athletics can thus be seen as another strong point of Pi Lambda Phi fraternity.



When activities are taking place — a Pi-Lam is there doing it. No matter what the activity; Student Government, Fraternity System, Orientation, R.O.T.C., and others, all have brothers and pledges of Pi Lambda Phi as creative leaders.

Heading the list of brothers on Campus is Fred Lane. Fred, the Action Party candidate for Student Body President, is the immediate past Treasurer of the Student Government. Past activities of Brother Lane include: Director of Orientation, Executive Director of Gator Growl, and Secretary of Student Affairs on the Student government cabinet.

A past chapter Rex, Fred has received an extensive list of honors. He was the Outstanding graduate in the school of Journalism, Outstanding student leader, President's Award, and the highest campus award being named the Outstanding Male Graduate in the graduating class of 1964.

Florida Blue Key Men's Leadership Fraternity, Hall of Fame, and Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities are each singularly distinguished honors. Brothers Fred Lane and Mike Colodny have been named to all three with Brother Lane appearing in Who's Who twice. Brother Ed Abbott has been recently tapped as a Blue Key Member.

Brother Mike Colodny has been elected twice chapter Rex. The all-powerful force in Action Party, brother Colodny has served the House as Political Representative, campaign manager for presidential campaigns, election official, poop marshall, and steering committee head.

This Spring Brother Hauser was elected the President of the Interfraternity Council and therefore is the Executive in charge of the entire Fraternity System on Campus.

Brother Sam Ullman, a candidate for the Student Board of Publications, has worked as an Alligator Staff writer, Homecoming Transportation chairman and is a Past President of Hume Hall Council. His efforts are supplemented by those of Brothers Sandy Sadja and Dan Davis. Sandy is a member of Arnold Air Society, Commander of Anger Flight, Chapter Vice President and also Chairman of the Pi-Lam National Convention. Brother Davis is the Past Vice-President of the Freshman Class, member of the Legislative Council and also works actively on Orientation.

Other prominent Pi-Lam Campus Leaders include: Richard Cowen, President of Alpha Delta Sigma Advertising Honorary; Bob Lurie and Drew Greenfield, I.F.C. Committee members; and Jim Mandel, Orientation staff member.

A returning Pi-Lam law Student, Herb Schartz is a past Air Force Division Commander, who has finished five years in the Air Force. He has returned to the U. of F. to take an active part in Homecoming and the Honor Court.

Word to Prospective Pledges



When the excitement of rush week has become a memory and you take stock of yourself, you will begin to wonder about the organization represented by the pledge pin which was placed on your lapel. One of the first questions you will endeavor to answer is, what is fraternity?

You will decide that parties, dances, and big chapter houses are not alone symbols of genuine fraternity. Even scholarship standing alone is inadequate. For fraternity is an inner spirit, at once both idealistic and practical. Its application requires ceaseless effort on the part of college men to enrich their way of life, and to develop a finer sense of values.

Your primary purpose in matriculation at your university is to obtain an education. It is expected therefore that you will devote the utmost of your endeavors to your studies. Florida Delta is proud of its excellent scholastic record, and it is required that all pledges emulate and uphold that record.

Next to scholarship, the fraternity is interested in the extra-curricular activities of its men. An education is not completed by the mere preparation and recitation of daily classroom assignments. Regardless of what ambitions, preferences, previous training, or abilities the individual may have, he can find or acquire a new interest that will develop his mind and muscle.

However, a basic function of this fraternity is the development and promotion of the social interests of its brothers and pledges, but a successful program can only be measured in terms of the active participation of those who are seeking its benefits.
