PI LAM ATHLETICS

1967 marked the second successive year of growth and climbing in

the intramural statistics for the men of Pi Lambda Phi.

With only three sports of the nine - sport competition remaining, at this writing, the Lammies sit in third place in the 16-house league behind Sigma Nu and Lambda Chi Alpha. One of the Orange League sports that remain is softball, a traditionally strong one for Pi Lam, and could lift the house even higher in the statistics.

The season started off a bit slowly with waterbasketball. Even though the purple and gold were unable to win their eleimination contest, Dan Davis pulled off the amazing feat of scoring every single point that the

team made.

But matters really picked up in the next three sports, as Pi Lam teams made the finals in volleyball, the semi-finals in football and the finals again in bowling. In volleyball, the Lammies demolished TEP, Lambda Chi, and Kappa Alpha to earn a semi-final berth. Then came an easy victory over Beta Theta Pi before nosed out by Sigma Nu in the finals.

In football, Jerry Furnari and Nick Nicosia led Pi Lam to three easy wins before a 25-24 semi-finals loss. Ron Gottlieb and Danny Herman led the fine Lammie defense. Three men were honored with all-campus football selection. Furnari, Nicosia, and slipt end Bill Hawkins were named to the squad.

Then came bowling. Led by Mike Siegal, Mike Fried and Richard Sherman, the Lammies charged through four winning matches before succumbing to Lambda Chi in the finals. AEPi, Phi Tau, Sig Ep and Kappa

Sig were all victims of the squad.

Pi Lam lost their basketball encounter, but sparkling performances by such men as Mark Rosenbloom, Dan Davis and pledge Brad Raffle did not

go unnoticed.

In handball, Pi Lam fielded one of the most experienced teams ever witnessed at the University of Florida. "Old" brothers such as Don Lossman, Fernando Storch and Gene Kaye led the Lammies to an astounding 5-0 win over Sig Ep. The team lost their quarter-final match despite fine performances by Jerry Furnari, Allen Soden and Mike Resnick.

Pi Lam may not win the 1967 Orange League crown, but the Lammies WILL be among the league leaders, and even more important, have the sophomore and junior material to come back and win it all in 1968

A little closer to home, the new year saw ping pong and billiards come to the Pi Lam house. Mark Press defeated Dan Davis for the house pool championship, and Dan Herman completely dominated the ping pong table. Ken Garber, Mike Fried, and Paul Kaplan were also among the top ranked ping pong players. Dan Davis, third ranked, was credited with the fastest clocking for a slam, with a 129.8 MPH backhand on January 28. Dick Katz walked away with the Worst-Player-In-The-House trophy.

Five Pi Lams earned starting roles on University of Florida athletic teams. Brother Lee Steele was given the great honor of being chosen to be captain of the Gator tennis team. Brother Nick Nicosia will once again start in center field for the UF baseball team. And pledges Tony Dobies and Herb Appel both earned berths on the junior varsity baseball team, while pledge Paul Lunetta accomplished the amazing feat of marking the

varsity tennis team as a freshman.

Pi Lams once again were athletic leaders on varsity teams, on the UF campus, and at home. Next year promises an even greater season as the men of Pi Lambda Phi show that athletics are an important and enjoyable facet of university life.



Pi Lambda Phi Tops TEP, 24-6 In 'Nose' Bowl

For the second straight year, the Pi Lambda Phi pledges reigned supreme over the pledges of Tau Epsilon Phi, as the "Lammies" bombed TEP 24-6 in the traditional "Nose-Bowl" football game at P. K. Yonge field Sunday.

The annual contest is the highlight of the year for the two rival fraternities, as it is supposed to designate which of the houses was able to attract the better pledge class.

In the game's opening series, Pi Lam, led by quarterback Herb Appel, took the ball and drove 80-yards for a score, as the bewildered TEP's were unable to stop the potent passing offense.

The big play was a 35-yard Appel-to-Tony Dobies pass which put PLP on the TEP 30-yard line. Three quick passes over the middle, and an 11-yard aerial to center Gerry Burton made the score 6-0. Pi Lam's defense, led by

Pi Lam's defense, led by Lee Bucksteel and Brad Raffle then heldd the TEP's, as they did almost all afternoon.

Later in the half, Appel fired a sideline pass to Dobies, who then scampered 50 yards to the TEP 25. On the next play, Appel rocketed a 25-yard TD pass to wingback Rodney Max.

Moments before the half ended, TEP got on the scoreboard as quarterback Dean Glassman tossed a 3-yard scoring pass to Andy Reese, ending a 60-yard

The half ended with Pi Lam leading 12-6. The TEP's never came any

TEP started a drive to begin the second half, but a Glassman pass that was tipped into the air by defenders Bruce Levine and Jeff Berrin was picked off by Dobies, who played both ways in the contest.

Pi Lam took advantage of the break and drove 55 yards to paydirt.

The big plays were tosses to Max, Avery Weiss and the amazing Dobies. Appel polished the drive off by running the last four yards and diving into the end zone for the score.

Facing an 18-6 deficit, TEP began two successive drives that were stopped by sparkling defensive play on Pi Lam's part.






